Ken Flatto, former First Selectman for the Town of Fairfield, is now the Vice President, Community Services and Business Development for The Jewish Home of Fairfield.

He holds a Bachelor of Science Degree from Lehigh University, a Master’s of Business Administration from Cornell University and is a Certified Public Accountant.
